##### Chairman's Report 2018/19

The Community Council has continued to meet regularly and following last year's Community Council elections it has been good to welcome several new members and to have been able to maintain representation from all parts of the community council area.

The role of the CC in the establishment of the Kirriemuir Landward West Community Grant Scheme to administer community benefit from the Tullymurdoch wind farm development is now completed. The Grant Scheme was formally launched earlier this

month and the first community benefit funds are expected in the Autumn and, following an application process, grants will be made in the New Year.

The improvement of broadband for the rural areas of Angus has continued to be a topic in most meetings and while progress is being made with the infrastructure few if any households or businesses have been connected in the Kilry area.

The continued engagement of the Police with the rural community through the monthly bulletin has been appreciated especially if officers are unable to attend meetings.

Angus Council is offering training to community councillors in a number of areas and as a CC I think we should express our support for this initiative.

I am grateful to all the community councillors for their contributions not least Sue Smith for her work as Treasurer and Geoff Hobson for his IT and planning officer work and for filling the role of vice chairman. Jo Chapman- Campbell has been acting as secretary and her continued clerical support of the community council is much appreciated.
